<p><u>People:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sunburn. • Asthma attack. • Slippery ground – Twisted ankle/knee, broken leg/arm. • People getting lost. • Dehydration. • Medical emergency • People getting tired 	<p><u>People:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Free sunscreen available. • Bring asthma inhalers. • People given full briefing of rules and condition of maze, including ground condition. Stretcher, first aid kit, qualified first aider on site. • “Rescue” staff in maze. • People informed to take in water bottles. Spare water available. • Cell-phone/ telephone available. • People told of the amount of walking involved.
<p><u>Equipment:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sunburn • Dehydration • Lost • Slippery/uneven ground. 	<p><u>Equipment:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sunscreen. • Water bottles. • Flags to signal for help. • Adequate footwear.
<p><u>Environment:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heavy rain • Slippery ground 	<p><u>Environment:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check forecast. If rain starts, bring people out of maze. • Inform people of the condition of the tracks.
<p><u>Social Factors:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lose a person from the group. • Person caught endangering others’ safety. 	<p><u>Social factors:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Headcount when groups come out of maze. • All persons fully briefed on Maze rules and conditions.
